VIII. Admission Policy & Process

B. TECH:

Admissions to B. Tech is done through a common entrance test (EAMCET) conducted by the State Government.

The minimum qualification for admission to first year of the B. Tech course is a pass in the Intermediate (10 + 2) conducted by the board of Intermediate education, or any other examination recognized as equivalent there to with Mathematics, Physics and Chemistry.

- 70 % of the seats are allotted based on the merit in the EAMCET by university.
- 30 % of the seats are earmarked for Management/NRI candidates by the institute.
- In addition to the above, Diploma holders are admitted in second year of B. Tech to the extent of 10% of intake based on the merit in the ECET, under lateral entry scheme.

MBA:

The minimum qualification for admission to first year of the MBA is a pass in undergraduate course (10 + 2 + 3).

- 70% of the seats are allotted based on the merit in the ICET by university.
- 30% of the seats are earmarked for Management/NRI candidates by institute.

Course-wise Fee Structure and its basis. IX.

The fee for all the courses is decided by the Telangana Admission And Fee Regulatory Committee (TAFRC). The fee of the students currently admitted are specified in Government order dated 05.07.2019. The letter is enclosed as Details Enclosed in Annexure IX-1




