Both alligators and crocodiles are members of the reptilian order Crocodylia. But the families they belong to, Alligatoridae and Crocodylidae respectively, differ quite a bit. Crocodilians are the word "crocodile" what they really mean alligators and crocodiles you might already know, but also the lesser-known gavial family that contains the lone crocodilians. All told, there are 23 species of crocodilians.

As a group, crocodilians are pretty impressive animals. Their lineage goes back 240 million years. Among them, they've outlived the dinosaurs by a good 65 million years. They can swim up to 20 mph (32 kph) and run up to 11 mph (17.5 kph). They're most at home in the water and can hold their breath for up to an hour. Eyes situated atop their heads enable them to keep a lookout for prey, while their powerful tails swiftly propel them through the water.

Crocodiles and alligators are top-notch hunters and will eat anything they can get their teeth on, from fish and turtles to snakes and birds. With teeth specialized just for spearing, mauling and butchering, even boaters to chew its food — As if that weren't scary enough, crocodilians have incredibly powerful senses to detect their prey. Their eyesight above water is top-notch, and thanks to their pupils that can open up extra wide to let in additional light, they also have great night vision. And even though you can't see their ears, don't be fooled — these small, slit-like structures are sensitive enough to hear offspring calling from inside their eggs. Even their sense of smell is highly developed due to special organs in their snouts.
